PRIORY HOUSE

When we took on Priory House, it was with a vision—and a leap of faith. One year on, it has become the beating heart of our organisation: a creative, inclusive, and collaborative hub that is transforming lives and strengthening our community.

Throughout the year, Priory House has hosted a wide range of activities, from youth theatre rehearsals and performances to adult confidence-building courses, home education meet-ups, and mental health training. Our studio has been transformed into a performance space, a classroom, a gallery, and a safe haven—sometimes all in the same week.

We've welcomed new partners and practitioners into the space, including Everybody Dance Now, Out to Explore Yoga, and Neuro By Nature. Our ambassador team has grown in both number and expertise, helping us to deliver a more diverse and responsive programme of support.

The launch of our Be Head SmART programme has brought accredited arts education to home-educated children, while our Friday Night Band Night has created a safe space for young musicians to connect and create. We've also supported over 60 young people through Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) projects, ensuring access to creative opportunities and hot meals during school holidays.

Priory House is more than a building—it's a symbol of what's possible when creativity, care, and community come together. As we look ahead, we're excited to continue developing this space as a hub for wellbeing, learning, and belonging.

SCHOOLS & TRAINING

This year marked a significant expansion in our schools and training work. With the growth of our SEMH support team, we've been able to double the number of schools we work with across Dudley and the Black Country. This has allowed us to reach more young people, families, and educators with tailored support that promotes wellbeing, inclusion, and engagement.

Our training offer has also continued to evolve. We delivered our first-ever Neurodiversity in the Workplace Training, a milestone in our commitment to inclusive practice. This was launched alongside a new partnership with Claire from Neuro By Nature, who joins us as our Neurodiversity Ambassador—bringing valuable expertise and advocacy to our work.

We also delivered a range of Mental Health First Aid England courses, including our first Youth Aware course at Priory House on World Mental Health Day, and a two-day Youth MHFA course during Mental Health Awareness Week. These sessions brought together practitioners from diverse settings, equipping them with the tools to better support young people.

Our creative outreach has grown too. Sarah, our artist-in-residence, has led bespoke workshops in schools to support attendance, literacy, and wellbeing. Her work with the North Dudley Learning Partnership on the Dudley Discoveries project has engaged over 10 schools in exploring their local area through art—culminating in a gallery exhibition at Priory House later this year.



















WEST MIDLANDS YOUTH THEATRE

This year has been a landmark one for our Youth Theatre, filled with creativity, celebration, and community spirit. The highlight was undoubtedly our 25th Anniversary Concert at the Grand Theatre, Wolverhampton. Over 50 current and former members came together to rehearse at Priory House and perform a spectacular showcase of musical theatre, joined by professional alumni. It was a powerful celebration of our legacy and a source of inspiration for the next generation.

In July, 25 of our young performers took to the main stage at Dudley Pride, representing Bedazzle with pride and passion after their first rehearsals in our new studio space. Their performance was a vibrant reminder of the power of youth voice and visibility.

Throughout the year, our Youth Theatre continued to engage in meaningful community work. In December, they delivered a heartfelt Christmas performance in support of the Justice for Ryan campaign at a memorial in Stourbridge—demonstrating their commitment to using the arts for social impact.

We also launched our first in-house production at Priory House, Dare to Dream Jr., developed during February half-term and brought to life during our Easter HAF project. Over 30 young people participated, either performing or contributing to set and visual design. The result was three sold-out performances in our transformed studio theatre, showcasing not only talent but teamwork and resilience.

Our Youth Theatre continues to be a cornerstone of Bedazzle's mission—empowering young people through performance, creativity, and community. With new classes, collaborations, and productions on the horizon, the future is bright.



LOOKING AHEAD

July 2025 will see Priory House transformed into a gallery space as we host the culmination of the Dudley Discoveries project, celebrating the creativity of over 10 local schools through a public exhibition.

Alongside this, our summer holiday camps will run throughout July and August, offering a rich mix of Art, Music, and Performing Arts workshops, including a specialist SEND programme. Thanks to continued support, HAF-funded places will be available across all sessions, ensuring accessibility for families who need it most. Our Youth Theatre will be back in rehearsal mode over the summer, preparing for an exciting September production—soon to be announced.

We're also thrilled to confirm that our partner schools will continue working with us into the next academic year, allowing us to build on the strong foundations laid this year. All of our community classes and initiatives—from yoga and dance to art and music—will also recommence in the autumn, bringing familiar faces and new energy back into Priory House.

In September, we'll once again be supporting Dudley Pride, where our Youth Band will take to the mainstage, showcasing the talent and spirit of our young musicians. And before we know it, we'll be gearing up for the festive season, with more opportunities to connect, celebrate, and create together.

And as always, we'll continue to listen, learn, and adapt—guided by the voices of our young people, families, partners, and team. With a growing network of ambassadors, practitioners, and supporters, we are excited for what lies ahead.
